These cats should be appropriately hydrated (IV fluids if dehydrated), then an enema, and deobstipation (manual removal of feces) should be performed. This almost always requires general anesthesia, as it is extremely painful for an awake cat.

Subtotal colectomy, the removal of the majority of the colon, is considered the treatment of choice for the surgical management of megacolon that is not responsive to dietary and medical management. This is major surgery, but the overwhelming majority of cats respond quite favorably.

A common starting dose is $\frac{1}{8}$ (one eighth) of a teaspoon per day. If you don't see an improvement in your cat's constipation after three days, you can either give $\frac{1}{8}$ of a teaspoon twice a day, or increase to $\frac{1}{4}$ of a teaspoon once day. If this doesn't work, consider giving $\frac{1}{4}$ of a teaspoon twice per day.
