Notice how vital signs improve as excess secretions are removed...reducing risk for respiratory infection and hypoxia. 0900 O2 sat 89% on room air, bilateral rhonchi to bases auscultated, unproductive cough, heart rate strong and regular P-90, B/P-150/88, R-18 and T-99.3. Instruct need for prn trach suctioning to remove thick, tenacious secretions and improve ...

Documentation for tracheostomy care and suctioning 1. Gathering the equipment - PPE (mask and shield) - Bottle sterile saline that already comes in the kit - Trach suction kit - Towel - Pulse oximeter - Suction set up - Stethoscope - Clean gloves - Sterile gloves that are included in the kit 2.

o Any patient with a tracheostomy tube will have a double cannulae tube sited (preferably uncuffed if appropriate) o Time of discharge from a specialist area, or transfer between wards, is not between 2200 and 0700 (except in emergencies where transfer is into a critical care area) o A tracheostomy care plan is in use and completed correctly.

In a cuffed tracheostomy tube: Tell the client what you are going to do Remove secretions from above the cuff (via above cuff suction line if present) Deflate the cuff Suction the client via the tracheostomy tube Hold the tracheostomy securely via the flange or hub Place the PMV with quarter clockwise turn Monitor closely for signs of distress

Nursing documentation of tracheostomy care

Tracheostomy Component Functions • Outer cannula: Main portion of the tracheostomy, serves as connection between trachea and skin • Inner cannula: removable tubing that sits in the outer cannula.Allows easy removal for cleaning and care. • Cuff/Balloon: required in patient requires ventilator.Ensures ventilator air goes to lungs • Pilot balloon: assesses how much air is in the cuff ...

Tracheostomy Education for Patients and Caregivers

Good care starts with preparation, before a patient even arrives. It is too late to realise an essential piece of equipment is missing in an emergency! We know that problems have occurred due to a lack of provision of basic and emergency equipment at the bedside.

Tracheostomy

When a tracheostomy tube change (routine or emergency) is performed document the date and time of the tracheostomy insertion, name of person who inserted the tube, size and type of tube inserted (including inner and outer diameter, tube length and suction depth), Lot number, expiry date of the tracheostomy tube, patient condition throughout and following the tube change and any difficulties experienced during or after the tracheostomy tube change.

Clinical Guidelines (Nursing) : Tracheostomy management

Tracheostomy care involves application of scientific knowledge, sterile technique, and problem solving, and therefore needs to be performed by a nurse or respiratory therapist. Equipment Sterile disposable tracheostomy cleaning kit or supplies (sterile containers, sterile nylon brush or pipe cleaners, sterile applicators, gauze squares)

Tracheostomy Nursing Care and Management

Stand or sit in a comfortable position in front of a mirror (in the bathroom over the sink is a good place to care for your trach tube). Put on the gloves. Suction the trach tube. (Your healthcare provider will give you more information about the suctioning procedure). If your tube has an inner cannula, remove it.

Tracheostomy Care & Procedure - Cleveland Clinic

The tracheostomy ICP (see Appendix 4) is to be used for all adult patients with a tracheostomy whilst an inpatient at St Georges Hospital (this should be used in conjunction with the early warning score (EWS))

Documentation must be kept in the patient's bedside folder and updated on each shift. When complete this must be filed in the patients notes.

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Sample Documentation After Trach Suctioning

A tracheostomy is a surgical operation that creates an artificial opening made into the trachea through the neck. This may be temporary or permanent. A tracheostomy tube is usually inserted, providing a patent opening. The tube enables air-flow to enter the trachea and lungs directly, bypassing the nose, pharynx and larynx.

Sample Documentation: 12/05/10: 0900: P: Impaired airway clearance. I: Trach care - large amount of thick secretions cleansed from inner cannula, skin around trach is intact but slightly red. Client is able to expectorate secretions when encouraged to do so. Mist collar in place to maintain humidification.

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
